Member Spotlight on: Kurt Meyer

Where do you currently live and for how long? I'm originally from Kentucky but have lived in Arlington, TX since I was 13.

When did you join SWA and why? I joined about 20 years ago. At the time I joined several watercolor associations, and I started entering their juried competitions and getting accepted.



What is your favorite thing about SWA? I like the exhibitions and the meetings when I am able to attend.

Tell us about your art background. I'm a retired dentist. In college, one semester I was bored with taking 18 hours of science classes, so I signed up for an art class. At each class, we took turns going to the front of the class. Everyone had two minutes to sketch the

model, and that's where I learned to sketch fast. Once while in college I did a caricature drawing of a particular professor and unfortunately it got passed around. A few days later this particular professor called me to his office and when I went in, I saw that my drawing was tacked to the wall behind his desk. He said it was pretty good, and then told me to get the *heck* out of his office and get back to work. To this day I carry a sketch book with me every day and sketch people wherever I go. Occasionally my wife even lets me take a sketchbook when we go out to dinner.



What artists have inspired you, and why? Many years ago an artist friend recommended a workshop taught by Don Stone at Monhegan Island, Maine. I took him up on it, and had such a great experience that I returned every year to paint in the company of very talented



artists who were very accepting of a rookie painter. It was a great experience and a great opportunity to learn. Another memorable experience was a Don Andrews workshop at Springmaid Mountain in North Carolina. The theme was "Painting the Nude" (from live models) and Don would lock the door every day to keep curious passersby (i.e., males) from stopping in. We had a "show" on the final day and exhibited our work within the workshop. Don was a great painting instructor. I have also taken several workshops from Ted Nuttall, and he's been a big influence.

What is the back story about your painting "Cinco de Mayo" that won Best of Show at the SWA International Exhibition this spring? In fall of 2019 I traveled to

Santa Fe to take a Ted
Nuttall workshop and
found I was the only male
in a class of 9 students.
After the workshop, I went
alone to a nearby bar and I
loved the band so I stayed
a while. Of course I pulled
out my sketchbook and
also took some reference
photographs. This painting
was a result of that
evening.



What is your philosophy about your art work? Keep painting!
Something still left on your "bucket list": Go back to Maine and paint!


Carolyn Beth Pruet Patterson - Austin Artist, Wife,




Suzy Powell was accepted into the New Mexico Watercolor Society Fall Exhibition with "Take the Reins" and "Patriotism."


