Brenda Swenson, our juror, judged the digital formats to determine our winning art work. Congratulations to all who are included. It goes without saying that awards and Signature Status will be awarded to those deserving those honors. Our beautiful exhibition will be available for viewing worldwide. We had entries accepted from India, 2 from China, 2 from Canada and 2 from Malaysia. Skeeter Murley will have the show on our website for viewing as soon as winners have been chosen by our juror. He also will be compiling a catalog. **Congratulations to Suzy Ware and Dianne Arnette who earned their Signature Status with this show!** We have our tax reports in order thanks to Pat Banell and Jane Barrett. So, business continues as expected.

Be positive and look for the bright side. I wasn't thrilled to cancel my yearly art trip, but was happy to not have been in Italy and been stuck there with record deaths. I have 57 works up (my largest exhibition) and no one will see it with a cancelled reception and viewing by appointment, but I feel blessed to have travelled where I have been to even create the show. So, I think we all need to remain optimistic.

Staying Engaged with Art by Darla Bostick

As we have all hunkered down to see this virus through I have heard some great ideas from friends. Those who know me well know I am not a "phone" person. In fact, my outgoing phone message sends people to call my home phone if they really want me to hear the message. I have always been a huge fan of audio books, though, and my phone allows me to download through the public library. I can listen to a great novel while I lunch or work on the computer...even take it with me as I walk the dog. They are available for free through your library. (Although if your library card is not current, renewed each year, you may have some difficulty with this). It might be a great time to listen to a classic you were not required to read in school. (*Call of the Wild* is one of my new faves in that category.) Here are some ideas to keep you inspired with your art work: Watercolor Soceity of Houston (WaSH) has put their show online: <u>IWE show online</u> Did you know you can tour an art museum from home online? Crystal Bridges is a terrific art museum located in Bentonville, Arkansas. Simply click on the video arrow on each image <u>here</u>. The Fort Worth Community Arts Center posted <u>this</u> about their exhibits. The Fort Worth Museum of Science is <u>virtual</u> too. Other Museums of Art that have gone virtual are: Museum of Modern Art, New York; Musée d'Orsay, Paris; The J. Paul Getty Museum, Los Angeles; National Museum, New Delhi; The Art Institute of Chicago; Georgia O'Keefe Museum, Santa Fe; Detroit Institute of Arts; The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; Museo Frida Kahlo, Mexico City; Tate Britain, London; La Galleria Nazionale, Rome; Rijks Museum, Amsterdam; Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York.

If you are missing our monthly demo, how about some free tutorials? You Tube always has wonderful instructional videos, like this one covering basics: <u>Tutorial</u> or this one to inspire those who are intrigued with <u>portraits</u>. The Dallas Museum of Art offers this online 3D viewing of their <u>Flores Mexicanis exhibit</u>. Even though it isn't watercolor, you

may find this <u>flipbook</u> truly charming and innovative. For laughs, check out <u>recreated</u> <u>art</u>.

Just for fun, if you have created something during the "down" time, send it to Elaine Jary for the next newsletter...it doesn't have to be watercolors---it's not a contest!
