She continues to expand her knowledge of painting on porcelain, as well as working in plein air and studio in watercolor, oil, acrylic, and pastel.

Paula produced nine of her own art instruction videos; the most re-cent "Painting Water with Paula White." Other videos are Landscape Design, composition, and techniques for the porcelain artist; Composition, Design and Color, Grapes, and Color As I See It, The Mixing Color Wheel. She is also the author of the Essence of Roses.

Paula has won awards in national art shows, including Best of Show in the Trinity Art League member show and Artist of the Month voted on by the members of Southwest Watercolor Society. Her art is in many private collections in the US and abroad.

She is also has paintings in over two dozen shows shows all over the country.









Knowledge Transfer

Only One Response. Shirley's favorites.

Maybe more responses during the Summer Break!

- 1. 2 favorite brushes are:
- # 10 Escoda...I like to paint large (1/2 to full sheet), for me it works well to paint any subject.

³/₄-inch Silver Series Black Velvet Cats-tongue/Oval for backgrounds; Holds a lot of paint and has beveled tip to cut into even the smallest spaces.

2. Well this is really tough and I had to really think about this one because I like a lot of color and love to build beautiful color schemes, so for only 3 colors; I would choose a semi-triad of: Y/O-Quin Sienna by Danial Smith, B/V- Winsor Newton's Smalt Blue and Danial Smith's Quin Red which leans to the cool side.

The Y/O and B/V are compliments which create gorgeous contrast and make beautiful warm or cool neutrals and primary red for a variety of cool pinks. You can glaze the Quin Red with Quin Coral and get a primary red.

- 3. I have painted only tropical scene's of flamingo's as the subject, on large tiles which have been primed with white gesso, then painted with primarily Winsor-Newton water-based oils and then sealed with Liquitex indoor/outdoor varnish.
- 4. Favorite tool: I have a set of stylus embossing tools in various sizes I use to apply mask or to trace.
- 5. Favorite pencil: A plain, cheap, #2 yellow mechanical pencil.
