#### **SWA Juried Membership Exhibition: Entries DUE THIS MONTH!**

Because of the problems encountered with the CaFé' Entry System used for the International Exhibition last spring we are using the traditional method of entry for the 2014 Membership Exhibition. The prospectus is posted online and we are looking for another successful display of our works. The show will be at the UNTHSC Atrium Gallery just down the hall from our regular meeting space each month. Our juror is Benito Huerta, Professor and Director/ Curator of Department of Art and Art History and The Gallery at UTA, University of Texas at Arlington, TX; artist, curator, lecturer, juror.

#### **Entries and Payment:**

Current members (2014) may submit three paintings; only one may be accepted. Use JPEG format with 300 resolution (DPI). The longest side of digital image cannot exceed 1200 pixels. Use this format to name files:

Example for Jill Brown's three entries:

There are 3 methods to enter and each has a different deadline.

CD entries cannot be mailed for this exhibition but they may be brought by hand to the 15 September monthly SWA meeting. Payment and entry form must accompany the entry. CDs will not be returned.

Be sure the email includes entry information: title, size, and price. 

#### September 15<sup>th</sup> Demo Artist Amy Ehrlich

Amy M Ehrlich, founder of the Creative Arts Studio School of Art & Gallery, (1986) is also an award winning artist and author of the children's book, *Yes, You Can Draw!* She holds a BA degree in textiles and design from the University of Missouri, with additional studies in art & education from the University of Texas, in Arlington and North Texas, with graduate hours at SAGU, and the University of Phoenix.

In 1999 Amy was added to the prestigious list of Texas artists that work with the Texas Commission on the Arts. There she served as Resident Artist for Imagisphere Children's Museum from 1999 to 2000 in N. Richland Hills, Texas.

Amy was called to teach at Covenant Christian Academy as an art instructor in 2003, where she taught PK3-7<sup>th</sup> grades. She received a Master Teacher's award in 2013. Amy was a recipient of a Japan Fulbright Memorial Scholarship in 2007, which took her to Japan for a three-week study-tour of Japan with other educators from the United States. She has also traveled to Canada, Bali and Italy for inspiration. Amy supervised a group of art students to France and England in July of 2011. Currently she is a part time art instructor for Our Lady of Victory Catholic School in Fort Worth.

She continues to show and display her artwork through public and private venues, and through her web site, <a href="www.amymehrlich.com">www.amymehrlich.com</a>. She has had several one-woman shows, including Imagisphere Children's Museum, and the Fort Worth Botanical Gardens, among others. Her work has been exhibited throughout Texas and in Missouri and Connecticut. She is a signature member of the Society of Watercolor Artists (2002), and belongs to and has won awards in the Trinity Arts Guild, the Southwest Watercolor Society, the Irving Arts Association, & the Irving Arts Connection. Amy is also a member of the Texas Art Educators Association and St. Michael's Catholic Community.

"I am a painter of inspiration, color and design. My talent is a gift from the Lord that everyone possesses. I try to show the joy I feel for the many gifts I have been blessed with. Sometimes in the process of planning for my students I find inspiration for my own paintings. It gives me great joy to help others discover their own talents and to see them grow."

#### **Introducing SWA Member, Nancy Maas**

Nancy joined SWA two years ago after moving to Texas from Ithaca, NY where she and her husband lived for 30 years. They still have a home in northern Michigan where Nancy is involved in the art 'scene' there.

"From earlier experiences with watercolor societies in NY, AZ and CA, I knew how fulfilling it is to have contact with other painters, especially to maintain and improve one's painting skills. SWA's website displayed an array of interesting activities and events, so I didn't hesitate to join!" She adds, "Now that I am a member, I appreciate the format of the monthly meetings: the insightful critiques, followed by guest demonstrations and news of ongoing or upcoming events. The juried shows reflect the high standards of the organization, as well. The society's leadership, under Darla, is impressive in its commitment and organizational skills. The Fort Worth area is lucky to have such an effective crew."

"While I expected to major in art in college (Smith College), I became fascinated by history and let the art side of my personality take a back seat. My parents encouraged me, but my mother, in particular, was wary of the prospect of pursuing art as a career. I combined art with a career in education (Harvard MAT, Stanford Ph.D) and was indeed able to support myself by teaching at the university level for over 25 years. Because my specialty is African and so-called non-Western arts, I became interested in the fabulous textiles of Latin America while in the Peace Corps in Bolivia, and later the sculpture and other art forms of sub-Saharan Africa. These influences seemed to have seeped into my artistic 'bones', although I know that masters like Winslow Homer and John Singer Sargent also have had an effect on me." Nancy continues, "In addition to SWA, I belong to the San Diego Watercolor Society and Taos Society of Watercolorists, NM (signature member in both) and Charlevoix Circle of the Arts in northern Michigan. Aside from being in a few national shows, I've won an occasional award, such as first prize for an architectural watercolor, Central NY Watercolor Society (2010), People's Choice Award, Ithaca NY (2011) and served as the official artist of the well-known Ithaca Festival, Ithaca, NY (2009). My work has been featured in articles in American Artist, Watercolor, and several regional magazines in Michigan and New York."

Nancy sells prints through her website and her gallery exhibitions in NY and Michigan have helped her understand something of the business side of art. "My work is now featured at the Ward Gallery, Petoskey, MI, and continues at Contemporary Trends, Ithaca, NY and, indirectly, at the Elm Street Studio, Keller, Texas where I had a show last year." Currently Nancy is focused on improving her skills as a painter. In Northern Michigan she exercises her plein air painting with a group of like-minded artists. "The discipline is terrific, as we paint around the town of Charlevoix twice weekly, but the results can be humbling!" In Texas she has continued working in watercolor but confesses she is also trying her hand at liquid acrylics. She hopes to capture impressions of north Texas in a series explaining "Right now I am merely beginning the process, trying to feel my way to something that works."

Nancy is a seasoned art instructor, having given watercolor workshops. She concludes, "Like so many of us, I am immediately drawn to, and inspired by, Nature. The landscape (or seascape) has long been a staple of my art. I enjoy the human figure, too, but feel I need more work in that area. Lately, I've found myself also doing work from the imagination – influenced by my experience in Africa, for example, and abstracts, which relate to my spiritual journey. So, in sum, I'm all over the place as to subject matter. I work conventionally, painting in watercolor (or acrylics) on paper or board, attempting to capture an impression which relies on working wet in wet, as well in a more painterly fashion as an image builds. I absolutely love the accidents that happen in watercolor and consider myself a 'watercolorist for life.' Attempting to manage the power of the medium in a respectful way offers us a great challenge!"

"Watercolor Weaving" is an approach Nancy has been using for 25 years. She shares, "I accidentally happened upon an approach to creating a work on paper which I've dubbed 'watercolor weaving.' She explains: "Twenty five or so years ago, I was painting plants in spring in upstate NY while my children napped. I didn't like the result. Instead of conveying the energy of spring growth, my painting seemed lifeless. I started to cut up parts of the image, rearrange strips, and liked what was happening. Over time, I have developed a way to capture movement by painting two paintings, cutting them up, one into vertical strips, the other into horizontals, and interlacing them to produce a final image. The cutting is usually quite irregular and intuitive, and a lot depends on the color of mat board to which the image (like a paper doily) is glued for final presentation. A short video on my website <a href="https://www.nmaas.com">www.nmaas.com</a> shows the entire process. The effort is time-consuming but the results are often worth it. Galleries continue to be interested in this series and I am currently running out!"
