Ann Winchester, our Vice President, doesn't need an introduction to the members of SWA. Her phenomenal portraits are always contenders for the top awards in our shows and many of our members are her students. Ann says her favorite painters are Charles Reid and Mary Whyte.

Ann worked in the printing industry doing what is now called image assembly. Then they were called strippers and she spent years looking at four color process negative. This is where an image is separated into yellow, magenta, cyan, and black. When she started painting "it was a pretty easy step" to paint water color in layers which has served her well because "you get a more luminous image that way". These days she does commissioned portraits in watercolor or oil and also teaches watercolor and oil classes.

For this demonstration she will be showing her shortcuts to designing a composition and working on top of a non-objective background using white ink.



Shirley's first exposure to art came at age 12 when she took oil painting lessons with her mother from a church member on Sunday afternoons. It was not however until after time spent in the military, graduating and practicing as a registered nurse for 31 years and raising a family that her interest in painting was rekindled.

In 1995 she made the now famous "bucket list" and at the top was to begin taking art classes. Though she had no particular medium in mind, after discovering watercolor she knew she had found something special. To that end she then began studying for a short time with Jo Williams of Denton who taught her a foundation in composition and color mixing; principles and skills she still references today. As her interest in art grew a fascination with Renoir's work in portraits inspired her to begin studying with Ann Winchester in 2005.

Shirley has been a member of SWA since 2005 and is the Membership Director. She also prints and distributes the newsletter to those that don't have access to the internet.

Born in La Rochelle France, he traveled Europe and America with his military family eventually settling in San Antonio, Texas. Ric has exhibited in many states throughout the US including California, Texas, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, Florida, Kentucky, and Washington. His work includes architecture, still life, portraits and traditional objects. Ric has been the recipient of many national awards and most recently was featured on the cover of Watercolor Artist Magazine. Ric paints with Schmincke Horadam watercolors and gouache and endorses their product nationally. He teaches workshops throughout the US.
