This year is the 3<sup>rd</sup> SWA Invitational which is a very special exhibition. There is no entry fee to be included and there is no juror! The only way to be part of this exhibition is to give your time and talent to SWA. This special exhibition honors our many volunteers who help to make SWA happen! The first year we were lucky to be invited to Grapevine as they hosted the traveling NWS Exhibition. Our works were displayed next to theirs in the same exhibit hall. Last year Irving hosted us in the Focus Gallery of the Irving Arts Center and we added a new perk...the people's choice award for \$100. For 2014 a location has not yet been found. Our former venues in Grapevine and Irving cannot host us. The search is on...do you know somewhere we can use (that is free?). Let any of your board members know. It would be nice to have the show before our October Membership Exhibition! We need space for 25 paintings but we could have as many as 50 if the space allows.



## **SWA Has A New Affiliate**

You may not know about Colors of Nature. It is a Canadian company making watercolor paints that are real colors reflecting the true colors of nature and are made completely from natural ingredients (making them safe for children and adults). At the end of each month they tabulate the total savings earned through our code and donate that same amount back to SWA. If any of our members make a piece of art using their paints they will post it on their website and blog and direct people to a site of the artist's choice. Ownership of the image belongs to the artist. Colors of Nature only posts the work on their website and blog and would seek permission from the artist for any other use. ### **Introducing lok-Hou Pang**









lok-Hou is not a new member by any means, but he has an interesting background! Upon first meeting lok-Hou at a meeting I stumbled through his name and came fairly close...he simply told me it's pronounced like John Lennon's wife Yoko. He is pretty easy to find at meetings (when his work demands allow him to attend)—just look for a big smile! lok-Hou was born in Macau, a world-famous casino city 40 miles from Hong Kong. He has been living in north Texas for over 30 years as he studied for his PhD degree at UT Southwestern Medical Center, worked in Alcon for 20+ years and is now a professor at UNT Health Science Center.

He explains, "I joined SWA in 2010. I was ignorant about SWA until I accidentally saw the 2010 membership exhibition. I loved most of the paintings and decided to join to learn from this talented group of artists." lok-Hou is also a member of SWS and then there are the science and education associations.

About SWA he states, "I love everything about SWA-- the friendship, monthly critique and demos, painting-of-the-month competition, as well as the twice a year art shows." He has helped with the hanging of shows and confesses, "I have no formal training in art. Instead, I am a scientist by training. To me, painting is very similar to science: I simply report graphically my observation, either real or vision in my mind, while solving technical problems in between. I enjoy the process of painting tremendously, often more than the final product. Therefore, I tend to work on details in a painfully slow pace. I am very much focused on watercolor, but also dabble occasionally in oil. My output has been meager, typically two or three paintings a year."

Upon close observation of his paintings, it is easy to see why two or three a year seems like a lot. His paintings carry a reflection of his cultural background and are painstakingly detailed. He says, "My paintings must be pleasing to the eye and must not contain sad or depressing implications."


lok-Hou hasn't had his art work published yet, but is on the editorial board of several science journals and has had work published in the science field. As for honors he related, "The most important honor bestowed on me is that I became a Signature Member of SWA in 2013. I have also won the "Best of Show" in the 2012 Arlington Visual Art Association's Juried Art Show, and various 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places in local art shows." He forgot to mention that he won First Place in the SWA May Art of the Month. In November he will bring back his winning piece to vie for the SWA Artist of the Year Competition. He is one of those rare artists who attained signature status in SWA in 5 consecutive exhibitions.

When asked about his 'Bucket List' he shares that he and his wife have a list of about 20 royal palaces they want to visit at some point. "We have seen only seven. We also want to visit all the continents-- we are half way there." He adds, "With so much left on the list, we have no plan to 'kick the bucket' soon!" lok-Hou volunteers in healthcare-related events and has a personal goal to complete a marathon in the near future. "I started running five or six years ago, and have won about 20 medals in races of various distances, from 5k to half marathon."

### Step-By-Step Demo by Judy Huebener


Since we don't meet during the summer months, it's fun to have a newsletter demo! This month features a painting by Judy Huebener. First, Judy confesses this painting was not done from an original photo. She had cut this out of the newspaper several years ago, planning to paint it someday.







After using a projector to "draw" the picture she painted a preliminary wash using Stephen Quiller's Paynes Grey on the interior of the car. The next layer of color was Holbein Ultramarine Light for the denim. Judy employed frisket on the frayed denim edges of the holes to preserve the white. To begin the skin tones she applied a yellow wash on the face, hands and knees. The sunglasses were next and then she added some darker grey to the car interior.





Judy adds, "I had just bought some Aquarelle Turquoise Green, which I used to paint the shirt, as compared to red in the reference photo." To bring out the shapes she added the shadows to the hat and added red to the face, hands and knees. "I painted his mustache last. I think it is a pretty good likeness and people recognize who it is. Do you know who it is?" (Try Alan Jackson)
